

COMMERCIAL LIQUOR PERMITTEE BULLETIN #05

Issued April 25, 2022

Commercial Permittee Bulletins are issued on an as needed basis. The information is primarily intended for Saskatchewan commercial liquor permittees.

Special Use Permit

The Alcohol Control Regulations, 2016 (Regulations) have been amended to allow a special use permit to be issued to a pedal-powered conveyance that is used in the business of providing public transportation.

Policy

Special Use - Pedal-powered Conveyance Permit

"Pedal-powered conveyance" means a four (4) wheeled bicycle-like vehicle, with two (2) wheels connected with an axle in the front and two (2) wheels connected with an axle in the rear, that is primarily pedal-powered.

Pedal-powered conveyance is to be equipped with:

- horn or bell;
- mounted mirrors;
- brakes, reflectors, headlights; and
- grab rails.

Permittees are to comply with the following conditions:

- a copy of the permit is to be retained on each vehicle;
- a minimum of two (2) staff members are to be present at all times during operation:
 - o one (1) operator/driver; and
 - o one (1) attendant to serve liquor and supervise;
- the operator and attendant must have completed the Serve it Right Saskatchewan certification;
- patron self-service of liquor is prohibited;
- each passenger must have a seat;
- all liquor purchased, provided or consumed on the vehicle must be from the permittee;
- liquor may be served and consumed while the vehicle is in motion;
- non-alcoholic refreshments must be available;
- patrons are not to be served alcohol in glass bottles or glass containers; and
- any glass bottles and glass containers must only be accessible to staff.

The Pedal-powered conveyance that is issued a special use permit must also comply with the requirements applied to all special use permittees that are outlined in the Special Use Permit Chapter in the Commercial Liquor Permittee Policy Manual.
